Religious Education/ Faith Formation Policies Policy #1

Expectations and Behavior Code:

- All Children and youth will be expected to behave in a Christian manner at all times showing respect and being cooperative with adults and other students.
- Children and youth will be expected to actively and respectfully participate in classroom activities and discussions.

Disciplinary Process:

- A warning will be given to the student with possible dismissal from the classroom and a telephone call to his/her parents/guardians.
- If misconduct persists, the parents/guardians will be requested to come and get their
 child and a meeting will be scheduled with the child's catechist and the Director of
 Faith Formation.
- All Serious misbehavior will be dealt with immediately. Parents/Guardians will be contacted to come to discuss the matter with all persons involved. Serious misbehavior could lead to suspension and/or expulsion from class for the year.
- While on church property, the use of tobacco, alcohol or any controlled substance by students or adults, before, during or after Faith Formation Sessions, will not be tolerated.
- Parents/Guardians of children/youth found to possess weapons, dangerous objects and/or look-a-likes on parish property or at parish-related activities, shall be notified immediately. Possession or confiscation of weapons or dangerous objects will be reported to law enforcement officials. Children/youth will be subject to disciplinary action which may include expulsion, a period of suspension or a recommendation to counseling services.

Policy #2

Children must attend Religious Education Classes the year before the Sacramental Preparation year. Attendance must be at least 50% during years other than the Sacramental Preparation Year. During a Sacramental Preparation Year, attendance at Sessions needs to be 100% if possible.

Safety Procedures

- Your child's safety is our concern. Students are asked to use the front doors of the church only for Grades 2-8th, and the Rectory door for Grades 1 & High School. Please do not use the south doors of the church hall to come to class. Please instruct your child to use only these doors and to watch as they enter from the parking lot and return to their cars after classes are over. Parents are encouraged to monitor the outside grounds before and after leaving classes.
- We will also have a fire drill during the month of October on a Wednesday evening.
 Instructions for leaving and returning to the building safely during a fire will be discussed in all the sessions in September and October.
